2. Project Summary and Objectives

The project's objective is to strengthen the institutional and service delivery systems for Solid Waste Management (SWM) in Kerala.

The project will support the government to improve the SWM situation in Kerala by providing SWM infrastructure

investments at both regional and municipal-levels. The project will support all 93 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) across 14 districts in Kerala in improving access to efficient and reliable delivery of SWM services to their populations.

The total project cost is USD300 million financed by AIIB and World Bank to the extent of USD105 million each and the balance USD90 million is counterpart funds by the Government of Kerala (GoK). The project includes the following components:

Component A (USD110 million): Development of Regional SWM Facilities which will support construction, rehabilitation, closure and remediation of SWM facilities servicing a cluster of local bodies;

Component B (USD150 million): Improvement of SWM Infrastructure in Participating ULBs will improve local-level SWM service delivery systems by providing funds to the participating ULBs; and

Component C (USD40 million): Institutional Development, Capacity Building and Project Management Support which will provide technical assistance and capacity building at state and local levels.

The project's implementation period is from June 2021 to June 2027.

5. Project Implementation Update

Under component A, the process of land identification and screening is ongoing. The consulting firm for undertaking feasibility study (FS) has been onboarded since June 2023 and is currently undertaking the FS work at the identified sites. Land transfer/acquisition process will commence once the identified site is confirmed to be feasible by FS. Under Component B, SWM Plan preparation for all participating ULBs is ongoing and the first batch of sub-projects aggregating to USD8 million have been prepared and are now being tendered.

Financial Management:

OAn overall budget provision of USD42 million has been made for the project under the approved state budget for the period April 2023-March 2024. The Special Treasury Savings Bank (STSB) account has been opened for the activities of Components 1 and 3 and is receiving funds from the GoK consolidated fund as

Audit Department (KSAD) have been completed up to FY 2021-22. KSAD has completed only 10 out of 93 ULB audits due for FY 2022-23. This will be reviewed during the upcoming mid-term review mission. The Finance Expert deputed from the Government is in place and is being assisted by the FM Expert of the PMC. IUFRs are being submitted regularly and latest IUFR was submitted for the period ending September 30, 2023. The next IUFR for the period October 2023 to March 2024 is due by May 15, 2024. The first external audit report of the project (for FY 22-23) was submitted and was found to be acceptable. The next audit report for the period ending in March 31, 2024 is due by September 30, 2024.

6. Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

A GRM exists at the SPMU and at the DPMU level. Designated staff at SPMU and at each DPMU are responsible for managing the GRM desk. The project has finalized the MIS module on Grievance Management System. This system will collate information on grievances received via toll free number, on-line and written. This application would have a clear workflow for registration, action taken report, and closure of complaints after receiving feedback from the complainant, including the institutional mechanism with the escalation matrix. It was advised to simplify the registration process and to delete the feature on prioritizing the grievances as all complaints need to be addressed within the stipulated time frame.

The GRM complaints can also be registered on the project's website https://kswmp.org/, toll free number 18004250238 or on email grmkswmp@gmail.com. Till now, 81 grievances have been received mainly related to collection of waste from households or waste dumping at public places.
