	piped natural gas (PNG), install 1,080 compressed natural gas (CNG) stations to supply to the transport sector, and lay	
	16,186 inch-km of steel pipelines.	
Objective	The Project aims to increase availability, and improve accessibility, of natural gas for domestic, transport, commercial and	
	industrial users in 9 geographical areas (GA), across the states of Andhra Pradesh (with 2 GAs), Karnataka (with 5 GAs),
